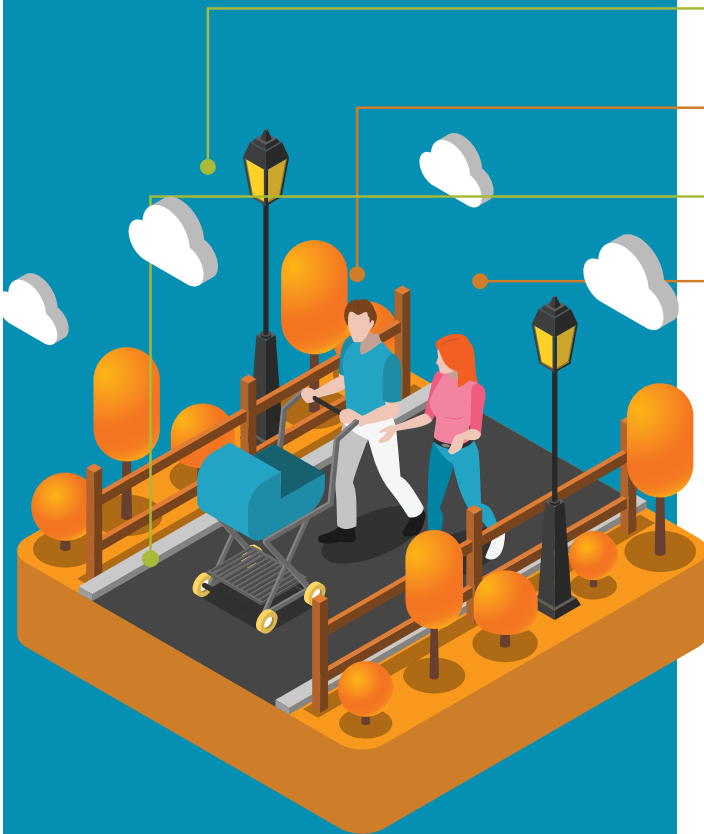


Help Osceola Residents Come Together to

WALK BLOCK

Osceola needs safe, secure, and plentiful places to walk.

Research shows that those who walk regularly have reduced rates of heart disease, asthma, osteoporosis, obesity, type 2 diabetes, stroke and some cancers. It also improves circulation, increases bone strength and reduces cholesterol. Walking can also be one of the easiest forms of exercise to fit into your day for those who are pressed for time.



We all want better sidewalks and safer communities. If you “Talk the Talk,” it’s time to “Walk the Block.”

Osceola sidewalks and walkways need your help.

At the September 6th, 2016 Osceola City Council meeting, the “Walk the Block” program was approved, providing reimbursement money to residents joining together to help improve the sidewalks and walkways throughout Osceola’s residential neighborhoods.

The city will reimburse each owner \$14/per linear foot of sidewalk constructed up to \$1,000. In turn, CCDC will reimburse the City for 50% of the City’s costs.

WALK THE BLOCK PROGRAM DETAILS:

A residentially zoned block of properties can apply for funding for the purpose of constructing/reconstructing the entire sidewalk within that block. All service walks (the walks between the curb and the sidewalk) and driveway aprons shall be reconstructed at the owners’ expense. Alley approaches shall be reconstructed at the City’s expense. All sidewalks and driveway approaches must meet all SUDAS and ADA standards. All residents on the block must participate to be considered for the program. Any owner wishing to participate, but unable to fund their share of the project, can enter into a payment arrangement with the City to extend payments over a mutually agreeable period of time. The City and CCDC have the right to make any exceptions to these program rules if deemed in the best interest of the City.
