Applications are due upon the first business day of the month. All qualifying applications will be considered at the regular monthly CCDC board meeting. We will let you know of the board's decision as soon as possible. Requests will be awarded based on available funding. Pillars Grant Program:

Focus: The Pillars Grant Program exists to improve the quality-of-life issues in Clarke County, Iowa. Clarke County Development Corporation, (CCDC) provides a grant application, which all applicants will receive with the grant guidelines.

The Grant Award Program is open to organizations holding a proper IRS Section 501(c)(3) or equivalent tax-exempt status.
